There is a time to speak and a time to remain silent – and often we get it wrong.

Sometimes we are too quick to speak and what we say is unhelpful.

too afraid to say the words need to be spoken.

We know that You are a God who speaks and a God who listens. You know us better than we know ourselves.

Thank You for the forgiveness You freely offer.
