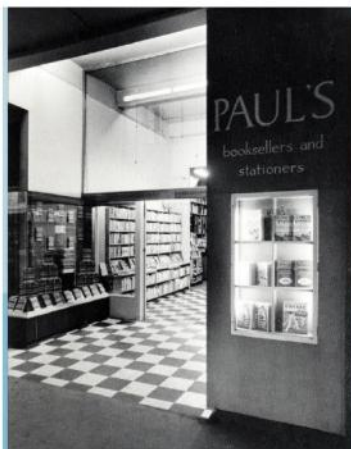

Cash Flow Summary – December 2025

Five weeks into a new calendar year, now is a timely reminder about the importance receipts from donations play in funding our church activities.

\$48,148 cash revenue was received in December 2025

\$28,735 from donations
\$17,700 from The Link
\$1,713 from other income

\$53,245 cash was outlaid in December 2025

\$34,758 on stipends, salaries and rent
\$2,410 on national and presbytery monthly levies
\$155 on outreach (\$155 pledged monthly
– CWS and Presbyterian Support)
\$8,530 for regular monthly expenses
(eg, cleaning, electricity, etc)
\$7,392 for other costs
(eg, upgrading computers, audit fee, etc)

Whenever outgoings exceed income, it is necessary to draw on cash reserves. On 31 December 2025, untagged cash reserves stood at \$2,828.
